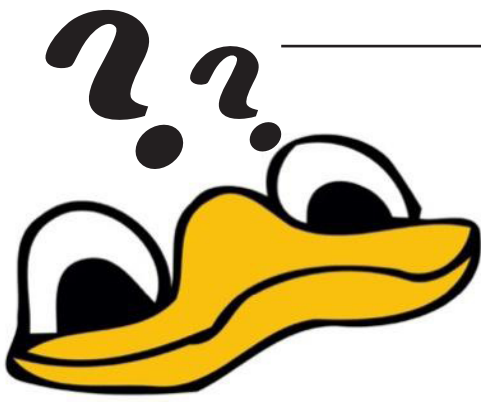

## *Keeler's Caramel Kite Puffs*

---



### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 Bag Puff Corn (I used Chester's Puffcorn Butter Flavor)
- 1 Cup Brown Sugar
- ½ Cup Butter
- ¼ Cup Light Corn Syrup
- ½ Teaspoon Vanilla
- ¼ Teaspoon Baking Soda

### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Pour puffed corn into a large bowl, make sure it is large enough that you will be able to stir the final mixture without making a huge mess.
2. Combine brown sugar, butter, corn syrup and vanilla in saucepan.
3. Boil 4 minutes stirring continually. (Start timing once the mixture comes to a boil).
4. Remove from heat and stir in baking soda. Mixture will foam.
5. Pour mixture over puffed corn and stir until all pieces are evenly coated.
6. Lightly grease or spray a large cookie sheet.
7. Heat oven to 250 degrees.
8. Spread mixture onto baking sheet (you need to move fast as it will start to harden up in the bowl)
9. Bake at 250 degrees for 45 minutes to 1 hour stirring every 10-15 minutes. (I had to bake mine for 1 hour and 15 minutes, it really depends on your oven.)

Let cool and then break into pieces and enjoy!

Born into a kite making family, Alicja's unique designs have already been licensed by European kite manufacturer Wolkenstuermer, and she's been a guest at festivals like Cervia, Cape Town, and Fano.

The kite she'll be teaching you to build is small but has a big presence in the sky. The CiSquare has a 28" x 28" sail, with a 13' tail made up of 84 strips of fabric. There's a lot going on visually and is very unique. You will be able to make it as unique as you'd like by picking one of the special workshop designs and your own colors.

This is a 2-day workshop and includes everything you need to build the kite: all fabric, spars, lines, pieces, and reinforcements. There are three kite designs to choose from with multiple color options available. You will receive this information once you have registered.

There are 15 spaces available for this class and is on a first-come, first-served basis. Please send your registration payment to secure your spot. 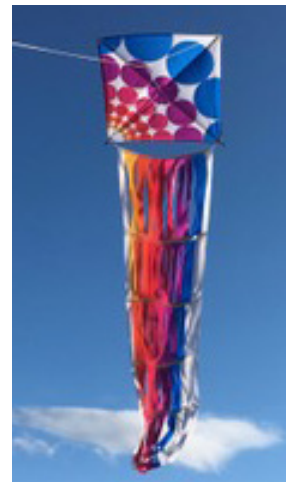

**NOT FUN FLY:** when you see people dressed in parkas..

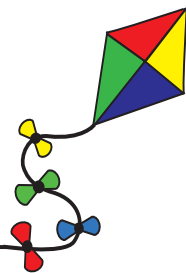
Again, these are just a few observations, and in general, every day on beach or field with friends is a great day. I could also add that some night flying is fun but not when mosquito netting is required.

We then proceeded to let out about 40 feet of line to the butterfly kite and got it in the air for a minute or 2 putting big smiles on everyone's face, when they left I know they had a good kite flying experience. What a shame that the place where they purchased this good kite would not give them any instructions on how to fly it.



# The Steve Edeiken Memorial Kiteflier of the Year Award

Andy, like most of us always like flying kites and remembers flying the “Dime Store” kites as a child. He got into modern kite flying around 1992 when a friend of his was in Oregon and saw sport kites and told Andy about them . Andy brought his first sport kite, a Cheetah, from Into the Wind to play with. Andy and his friend spent their lunch time getting the feel of the kite which encouraged Andy to purchase the book Sport Kite Magic written by David Gomberg. From this humble beginning, Andy purchased a Pro Am sport kite from Fran Gramkowski’s High Fly Kite Company. As the kite flying bug bit Andy really hard he went to the Meadow Mouse Kite Store run by Roger Chewning and purchase an EFM (Excellent Flying Machine Sport Kite) which he flew until the nose wore out and he wore out numerous leading edges. Andy competed from Myrtle Beach, SC to New-

port with these kites. Andy was also a member of the Eastern League competing at Belmar, Sandy Hook, Wildwood and both Ocean City (Maryland) events. Andy won numerous awards in sport kiting but one of the things he remembers as a highlight was qualifying for Nationals at 1993 Wildwood AKA Convention. Andy fondly remembers flying kites with Peter Lee at the Lakehurst Naval Station inside the Hindenburg Hanger, early indoor flying!!! Andy also competed in numerous regional events that have long since gone, he mentions the Mercer County Kite Competition as one of the good ones.

Around 1997 Andy was introduced to Rokkaku and Fighter Kites by John Smith, one of the founders of South Jersey Kite Flyers and it’s first President. His first fighter kite came from Into the Wind called a Hata, which is still available today. His second fighter was a Kevin Shannon called “GA”. Then like now, commercial fighter kites were hard to come by so Andy got his hands on a book called “Not another Indian Fighter Kite” by Geoff Crumplin. From that book Andy built Pits25 and Star Fighter, he used the material recommended in the book like Basswood for the spine which he had to heat form using boiling water and jigs.

In 1998 Andy attended the AKA Convention in Ocean Shores, Washington where he met Bruce Lambert and other individuals from the Northwest Fighter Kite Association. There he had a quantum leap of information on modern day fighter design and building. Bamboo spines, Icarex, Orcon fabric and solid carbon rods which were so light he could bow using a line are just a few of the innovations they taught him. Andy has been very fortunate to have enough of a supply of bamboo for the spine that he hasn’t had to revert to anything else. In 1999 while attending AKA National in Muncie Indiana Andy meet up with a group of Midwest fighter kite flyers know as the Bandana Gang, they have always assisted and been a great help with fighter kites at AKA up to this day.

Andy learned through many fighter kites that the designers overpowered their kites making them too fast and hard to control. 2003 Andy started making Freedom Fighter which had an addition lighter graphite bowed spine which slowed down, that won him the Paul E. Garber Award for Aerodynamics at the Smithsonian Kite Festival in Washington, DC.

Most of Andy’s kites are called “No T fighter kites” not because of the lack of a “T fitting” but because Andy’s last name is spelled without a T, from Doug Janelle back when SJKF newsletter was started as a way to remember how to spell Andy’s last name.

Andy designed 6 “No “T” Fighter Kites” and then there is a kite called Mark’s Kite, a no sew fighter kite which Andy named after his brother, that he teaches in classes. It is good low wind kite, easy enough for a beginner to fly but good enough to fly in competition. In fact at the 2006 AKA Convention in Iowa, Darren Skinner made the kite in the morning at a workshop given by Andy and in the afternoon flew in competition and won first place Novice Line Touch. The last time Andy taught this kite officially was in 2008 at the AKA Convention in Gettysburg, PA!!!!

One of the designs Andy has shared is the No Sew Buka Fighter Kite, this was a variant of a Bruce Lambert kite that Andy got Bruce’s permission to use and teach. That plan can be found online <http://fighterkitecentral.com/sxs/Andy%20Selzer%20No%20Sew%20Buka.pdf> . Andy added that anyone can look up on YouTube Bruce’s designs and they are still very relevant.

Andy’s travels have taken all over the US, San Diego was one of his favorite trips, Andy and Vi also attended the Zieker Kite Festival in Austin. That day at Zieker, Andy remember putting The Freedom Fighter #5 to the test against one of the local Indian Fighter kite guys (previous undefeated and use to flying against the local novice fighter kite flyers), during an over line touch point the competitors line broke and he retreated from the kite field and could not be found the rest of the day.

In 1998 Andy took a Sam Huston class at the Maryland Kitemakers Retreat in the no sew method of combining fabric using 3M 9460pc tape. He made a no sew Genki at that class which Andy then incorporated into his no sew fighter kite designs.

SJFK, Andy was one of the founding members in 1994 and continues to be an active member, organizing Shoo-be Kite Flys (you bring a box lunch) and participating in meetings, workshop and kite flys. Andy has served in numerous positions on the Board of SJKF and is still the elected 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President of that organization.

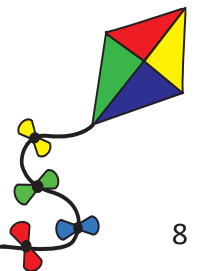
Andy was the fighter kite chairman for the AKA starting around 2000, from there he went on to run all the events Fighter Kite and Rokkaku Challenges at Treasure Island, Wildwood, Gettysburg, Ocean City MD and Iowa and Eden. Around 2005 Andy and fellow fighter kite flyers got together at the AKA Convention and rewrote the rules for Fighter Kite Competition, not many changes were need for the Rokkaku though.

In 2014, Andy had a debilitating stroke, limiting his use of his left side but that only slowed him up a little bit, he is still very active in SJKF. Vi, his life partner and love of his life, were together for 34 years until she lost her battle with lung cancer in 2017. Vi was very active and took care of the ground work. You can still find Andy at his favorite flying field, the local school yard plus prefers the beach at Brigantine NJ where he in 2005-2009 where he held the Brigantine Fighter Kite Competition and this year he will be the Head Judge in the Long Beach Island Fighter Competition .

Andy’s final thought was that he hopes the new generation continues flying fighter kites, he saw strong presence at nationals in **Shreveport**, LA and hope that they continue to make fighter kite flying fun for all and that they continue the innovation that he has seen. Andy also wanted to add a special thanks to Dave Young from the Tulsa Wind Riders and all those who have helped run fighter kite events throughout the years, far too many to name.

Andy was presented the Edeiken Award at the 2018 SJKF Holiday by Erin Edeiken, Steve’s Daughter. The only thing that could made this better was to have Vi by his side.

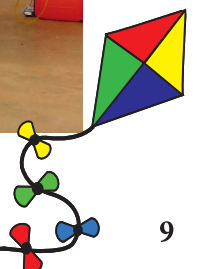
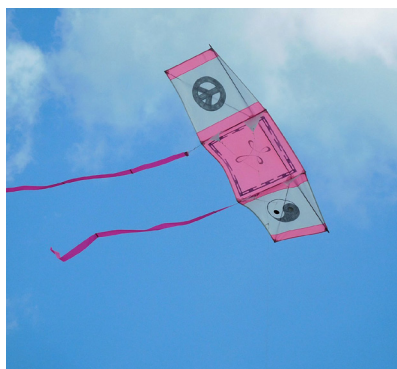
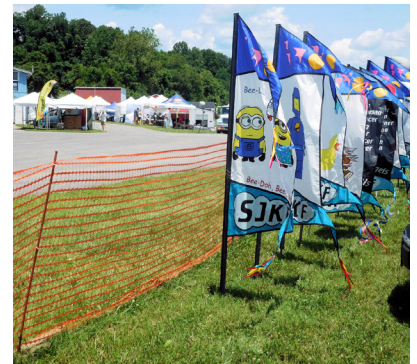
