Festival

As no one else has done a report on the festival this is the way I saw it from the start. Our first problem was that Wroughton lost their bid to get the big lottery grant and so decided only to open the site for corporate events at a price that made it totally outside our budget even if we could have got sponsorship. This happened in December so as soon as Christmas was out of the way we started looking for another location. Fortunately David living in Swindon had heard that Lydiard Park had been upgraded and he checked this out and having seen it was OK he checked availability and found this too was OK. He put to the committee at an emergency meeting and it was agreed to go ahead.

Once David had booked it we started to find the problems: the major one was that camping was not allowed. We are indebted to The Rummings family at Park Farm who came to our rescue allowing us to use their orchard. OK the grass may have been a bit long but what a lovely site.

Next we had to have marshals for the car parking and after trying all the usual scout groups etc. no one was available. This time we were rescued by Pete W. who had contact with the 4x4 groups and after a worrying start they turned up trumps.

As soon as the site was booked David started contacting our traders and suppliers and I started work on the Heath & Safety requirements. With all of those and the contract documents I submitted 65 pages of paperwork. It was taking me several hours a day checking the documents correcting problems from suppliers and producing new ones. If I had still been working there is no way I could have done this and I don't know how David manages his part of it and working full time. Even then in the run up to the event I was contacted when I was in Weymouth to sort out some other questions and David had to source a supplier of temporary road way in case it rained and we had to get a lot of cars off the field. They didn't seem to understand that if it rained we didn't fly kites so there would be no one to get off.

Then the first of the traders pulls out not having paid a deposit. Height clearance of 1000ft eventually turns up. The marquee supplier wants to be on site at 07:00 and I try to explain politely about that time in the morning but eventually agree on 08:30. Early start for me.

Friday morning arrived all too soon and with fingers crossed for the weather we got started. David goes to do a radio interview but they have got the dates wrong. Our fantastic band of helpers turned up again and just got on with it. There is no way we can thank them enough. No names in case I miss some one! Marquee arrives dead on time but at the wrong gate, where does the skip go? Toilets arrive when we are trying to get a bite of lunch. Thanks Pete D for sorting that one. In the midst of all this activity the television crew turned up and we all had to fly kites in zero wind. We were tired before we started and they ran us up and down the field for ages. I shan't describe the way I felt by the end of it but it starts with Kn. Things had gone so well that there was even time to get to the hotel for a shower and feet up for half an hour before the social gathering. At least for some of us as Don had to go to Heathrow to pick up Lucas. These gathering are always good as you get a chance to meet every one and have a chat.

Saturday dawned bright and we couldn't believe it was Swindon. (Remember last year?). We gather on site and that is when we have to work again getting everything set up. Thank goodness for Marla as she just sorts the raffle. (Looks as if she may have done this before!)

Still traders missing and NO caterers. We phone and they are still in bed. No Swindon is next week. Oh dear are we a week early? We explain that we are on site waiting for bacon rolls and coffee so they start to move.

Before we know it fliers start arriving and have to register but at last we are ready. Who forgot to book the wind? Sunshine we like but flat calm doesn't help kites. The only people who can keep a kite in the sky are the twin liners. Well done to Airheads who flew most of the day, next year we will have to charge for use of the site for practicing. A few single lines struggled in vain to find moving air.

The evening is still balmy so David shifts every one out of the marquee to enjoy the evening sun while the raffle takes place. Thanks to every one who contributed to make this such a fantastic success. Without it we couldn't afford to run a festival.


Sunday the weather was just as good and even a little bit of wind. This was a bit fickle at times but it was good to see some of our big party pieces in the air. All around there were families picnicking and generally enjoying them selves. This made it all worth while.

All too soon it was time to pack up and again the band of helpers came up trumps. It comes down much quicker than it goes together.

That's how I saw this year's festival. In the week before there was no way David or I would have done another one and if the weather had been bad that would have been the end but looking around on Sunday made the difference. We have lost in excess of £1000.00 on this event and have to recoup this with our workshops throughout the coming year. Cleethorpes a major contributor did not take place and the returns from Bedford were very poor so we have a lot of work to do.

The question now is "Do we do it again in 2009?" Lydiard were pleased with it and would like to host the event again next year. By the time this is published the committee will have made the decision and will probably have started booking things. But that is not the end of it, your help is essential not only on the day but helping with fundraising throughout the year. If you have contacts for any of the facilities that would make them cheaper, any sponsors or any new ideas please get in touch. It is your festival we just try to run it the way you want.

We have a few ideas about traders, caterers and layout but do let us hear your views. Arthur

MIDDLE WALLOP KITEMEET CONFIRMED FOR 5th AUGUST 1990

By kind permission of the Station Commander Col.G.R.Mallock A.F.C., Army Air Corps Centre and in conjunction with the Museum of Army Flying at Middle Wallop, near Andover, Hants.

All Kite Groups are invited to participate in this first -ever Kite meeting on the superb grass airfield.

As at Old Warden, the car park and public area are separated by a fence from the airfield; but in this instance , all Kite Group members will be able to drive onto the perimeter track (tinted on the diagram below) simply by showing identification cards at the inner gate, where there will be someone to direct you.

Kite Society, BKFA, STACK, EKG, MKF etc cards should be carried. They will also obtain the reduced admission charge of £1, instead of the normal £2.50 for all adult kitefliers.

This charge gives full access to all the Museum facilities, toilets, restaurant and shop. (No Card? then advise me) (RON GUNTER)

Traders have been invited and will be located in the public area, to which all kitefliers will have access.

Those who may wish to stay overnight, may camp in the field opposite in the area indicated. There are no toilets or running water in the field! Alternative B & B accomodation is listed on a separate sheet.

This is a trial meeting to assess the volume of support likely to develop from Southern based enthusiasts, and has been arranged to replace the earlier successfull meetings at Wroughton. Initial response to the first announcement has been encouraging, so See YOU there!!!





- · Airfields and low flying air traffic patterns.
- Members of the public....stunt flyers please take
